Multi award-winning guitarist Phil Robson is internationally regarded as a highly versatile and creative player who appears in all kinds of diverse settings, as well as being a being an acclaimed bandleader and composer. A large cross section of influences is apparent in the mix of Robson's playing and writing, but the end result has created an individual voice that prompted US sax legend, **David Liebman** (ex-Miles Davis, Elvin Jones etc) to say- "Phil is a wonderful guitarist and composer, definitely a unique player. We had a ball and hopefully I will be able to play with Phil again."

UK born Robson was an integral part of the London and wider European music scene for many years. He relocated to New York City in 2015 where he lived for 5 years before making the beautiful countryside of Northwest Roscommon, Ireland his home in March 2020.

Projects as a band leader/composer:

2023 – In this year, Robson began to do concerts around Ireland in various formats with the great Derry Based Tenor Saxophonist **Meilana Gillard.** There will be more to come!

2023 – IRIS – Robson was selected to take part in Music Network's '**RESONATE**' series as artist in residence at the Regional Cultural Centre, Letterkenny, Ireland. For this, he formed a multiple genre, cross art form collaboration, inspired by ideas of deconstruction, fragmentation and a shared love of improvisation. 2022 – Portrait in Extreme – Robson self-produced and recorded a project of all new original compositions and sonic soundscapes for an **EP/Album** released in March 2022 on **Lyte Records**. It features Phil on all guitars, electric bass, electronics (Ableton Live Suite 11), voice and lyrics, along with drum loops provided by **David Lyttle** and a guest appearance on two tracks by **Christine Tobin.** It was enabled by a grant from the Arts Council of Ireland Music bursary grant.

With Tobin, Robson co-devised & co-curated a highly successful, concert series called '**Tobin's Run on 51**' at the **Irish Arts Center** in **NYC**. Each show has a theme related to the socio-political history of jazz such as 'Rip, Rig & Panic', 'Village Vibes & Chasin' the Trane' etc and featured some of the finest musicians based in NY such as **Steve Wilson, Ingrid Jensen, Kate McGarry, Billy Drummond, Dana Stephens, Dave Binney, Peter Washington, Janis Siegel, David O'Rourke** and many more. These mixed media events included film clips, talks from guest speakers such as **Ashley Kahn**, audio clips, slideshows and much more. This was considered a unique format within the musical landscape of NYC and beyond.

Recording Artist: Phil Robson has recorded 6 acclaimed solo & 6 co-led albums, some of which were for the groundbreaking indie label '**Babel**' (www.babellabel.co.uk) and more recently for the UK/USA label '**Whirlwind recordings Ltd'** (www.whirlwindrecordings.com) and '**Lyte Records'**, as well as appearing on many other labels as a guest player and producer with diverse artists.

1990 – 1997 Visiting guitar teacher in various London secondary schools & community centres. **1997- 2015** Jazz guitar teacher at both **'The Royal Academy of Music'** and **'Trinity Laban College Of Music'** in London. Robson is still a visiting teacher in these institutions.

2010- current day - Visiting jazz guitar teacher at **'The Guildhall School of Music and Drama'** in London.

2006-12 Jazz guitar teacher at the 'Birmingham Conservatoire of Music'. External examiner between 2021-2023

Robson presented workshops in South Africa, India, Sudan, China, Bulgaria, USA, Germany and in many other countries as part of tours, festivals & often for organisations such as the **British Council**, **The Irish Arts Center NYC**, **Music Network etc**.

He taught on many jazz summer schools, both in the UK & beyond, e.g. **Chelmsford Jazz Summer** school (10 years), The **Dordogne Jazz Summer School** in France (3 years), The **European Jazz Academy'** in Germany 2012. In 2008 Phil was requested to coach the German youth big band BUJAZZO in Berlin at their summer school. In 2017, he gave masterclasses and performances with students of the **Bruckner University** in Linz, Austria. In Nov 2018, 2019, and again in 2022, he presented masterclasses and guitar lessons at **Kunstuniversität Graz** where he also performed with **Julian Argüelles** and other members of the faculty and students. He was an external examiner at **Leeds College of Music** for 7 years and at **Birmingham Conservatoire** in both 2021& 2022. In New York City he was a visiting teacher for the **Jazz Standard's** 'Jazz for Kids' program and presented workshops for both the **Irish Arts Center NYC** and **Bronx Arts Ensemble**. In 2022 Phil was both a tutor and performer in the '**Sligo Jazz Project' summer school/jazz festival** in Ireland. On behalf of Music Network In September 2022, he ran a series of workshops and classes in the community of Castlerea, County Roscommon for participants aged 55 and over, as he had done similarly in the Bronx, NYC. It's testament to Robson's ability as an accompanist alone that 'Universal' called him to join Barbra Streisand for her world exclusive on Jonathan Ross (2009). Being invited to join the BBC Big Band illustrates his great skill as a studio musician. He represented his country internationally for organisations such as 'The British Council' (South Africa, India, Bulgaria, China, Sudan), 'Jazz Ahead' (Germany), Jazz Services LTD (he was selected 3 times to perform at the Xerox Rochester International jazz festival' in NY state, which included presenting a workshop at the legendary Eastman College) & has performed at many other of the world's great festivals & venues such as 'Berlin Jazz Festival', 'Montreal International Jazz Festival, Monterey Jazz Festival, 'The North Sea Jazz Festival' in Holland, Tempere 'Jazz Happening' in Finland, Manaus Jazz Festival in Brazil, Birdland, Smalls, Ronnie Scott's, Yoshi's, Love Supreme, Cork Jazz Festival, Vancouver Jazz Festival etc.

As composer Robson was commissioned many times to write music & put new creative projects together by such organisations as the **BBC**, **Derby Jazz**, **Birmingham jazz** etc.

Early Background

Phil Robson grew up in Derby in the East Midlands, UK. He became interested in rock music and took up the guitar at the age of 10. Jazz was never far away however as Phil's father, Trevor Robson, was a superb semi- pro clarinetist & a popular figure on the local mainstream & traditional jazz scene. Phil's mother, Janet, although not a musician herself, has a fine imagination and natural ear for music, & encouraged the budding musician. Phil rapidly made progress on his instrument, taking a few classes in classical guitar and other one off lessons, but was largely self-taught until around the age of 14.

By an act of fortune or fate, they came across a small guitar shop in Burton Upon Trent, owned by **John Richards**. John is a highly renowned session musician & guitarist who, at the time, was the house guitarist at the 'Royal Shakespeare Company' in Stratford Upon Avon & Phil began to study with him on a regular basis over the next couple of years. John encouraged a great knowledge of many styles & skills & immeasurable progress was made in this period. This era coincided with Phil's discovery of the music of Miles Davis, Charlie Parker & Barney Kessel (the latter whom Richards had himself studied with) in his father's record collection, which had a profound impact on him whilst simultaneously still loving Black Sabbath, Zep & Jimi Hendrix. In a short time, Phil had begun to sit in on Trevor's gigs.

The final piece of the jigsaw slotted into place on discovery of 'Brownes' Jazz club run by Geoff Wright of 'Derby Jazz'. This was a thoroughly 'modern' jazz club & it enabled Phil to see the vanguard of visiting London bands such as Django Bates, Clark Tracey, Maggie Nichols & great South African influenced bands such as District 6.

By the age of 15/16, Phil was regularly playing Sunday lunchtime slots with 'Sonus 4', his father's band & was beginning to play regularly at 'Brownes' notably duetting with **John Etheridge** & **Dave Cliff** plus a formative gig with **Bheki Mseleku**.

Phil attended Derby's 'Wilmorton College Of Further Education' between 1986- 88. Although still continuing to develop & play gigs, that period was as much about investigating all aspects of life, but then, at the age 18, Phil moved to London to attend The Guildhall School Of Music & Drama, being the youngest person to ever do the post-grad jazz course at the time. The course was only for 1 year so, on leaving, Robson jumped straight into the deep end & has remained a professional musician since that time, being based in London for many years before spending time on the fabulous Kent coast before moving to NYC in 2015.

The first few years of being a London pro musician were scattered, but Phil played part time with the '**National Youth Jazz Orchestra**' where significantly he met long time musical friend & future co- leader of Partisans, Julian Siegel, as well as many others including sadly departed drummer Chris Dagley. Siegel & Robson moved into a 'jazz monastery' in East Ham around 1990, a house full of musicians where they played and checked out music day & night, much to the great tolerance of the neighbours!

Phil then played in a a punk/funk/rock band called **'Nimlet'** for a couple of years with incredible, maverick singer & keyboard player, **Alex Lewis**, which was very influential in the further broadening of Robson's sonic palette & concept of time.

Importantly, around the same time, Phil became associated with the original 'Vortex Jazz Club'

in Stoke Newington, Hackney, playing with many ex- 'Loose Tubes' musicians such as **Julian Arguelles** & **Steve Buckley**, which led to later gigs with **Django Bates' 'Delightful Precipice'**.

The Vortex went on to be a seminal part of Phil's musical life in the 90's and 'Partisans' could not have been formed without the club's 'open' musical policy, as well as being a factor in beginning a long time partnership with the great singer/songwriter, **Christine Tobin**. After a brief period living in Bow in East London, Robson went on to move to Stoke Newington, where he lived for many years. The N16 area is multi cultural, bristling with creativity of all sorts, & was particularly so in that period, when so many great musicians & artists were living there before the next decade's gentrification process kicked in.
